The proposed amendment to 19 VAC 30-40 relates to the placement of stickers used by counties, cities, and towns in lieu of license plates and is necessary to conform to instructions given to the Department of State Police by the Senate Transportation Committee, as well as requests received from various localities to change the location stickers are allowed to be placed. There have been no substantive changes to this proposed amendment since the proposed action was published.

The final action taken by the Department of State Police was completion of the Proposed Regulation stage. The Proposed Regulation was printed in the Virginia Register, Volume 17, Issue 4, on November 6, 2000. No public comments were received. The current action is the Final Regulation stage for this amendment. The title of the regulation is **Standards and Specifications for the Stickers or Decals Used by Counties, Cities, and Towns in Lieu of License Plates.**

This proposed amendment relates to the placement of stickers used by counties, cities, and towns in lieu of license plates. The statutory responsibility for establishing authorized locations to place the stickers rests with the Superintendent of the Department of State Police. The agency has done an extensive review of placement of window stickers, having contacted numerous jurisdictions and receiving input from the Virginia Municipal League, the Treasurer's Association of Virginia, the Virginia Association of Counties, the Virginia Association of Chiefs of Police, and the Virginia Sheriff's Association. In all instances, the agency has determined that the revision to the regulation will allow the efficient and economical performance of important

government functions.

This amendment relates to the placement of stickers used by counties, cities, and towns in lieu of license plates and is necessary to conform with recent changes to state legislation. This final amendment permits the optional placement of a sticker or decal to be affixed to the extreme lower left side of the windshield on a motor vehicle.

All changes are contained in 19 VAC 40-30 and are detailed as follows:

- 1. Change in requirement that sticker or decal shall be placed on the windshield to stating sticker or decal shall be placed at the bottom of the windshield.
- 2. Language removed that restricted the top edge of the sticker or decal from extending upwards more than three inches from the bottom of the windshield.
- 3. Language changed requiring sticker or decal which may be affixed at the upper edge of the center, to be affixed to the lower left corner of the windshield.
- 4. New language setting forth requirements of optional placement of sticker or decal to extreme left side of windshield.
