Section 19VAC30-170-30 of the *Virginia Regulations* is being amended to clarify that the issuance of a Simple Pardon / Restoration of Rights does not result in removal from the Registry and that an expungement does not include expungements of charges the person was convicted of.

Mandate and Impetus

These regulations are mandated by §9.1-915 of the Code of Virginia. The Secretary of the Commonwealth manages the process and review of executive clemency. Executive Clemency in Virginia takes on three forms; (i) a simple pardon which is a statement of official forgiveness and is sometimes referred to as a restoration of rights. While it does not remove the conviction from the record, it often serves as a means for the petitioner to advance in employment, education, and self-esteem, (ii) a conditional pardon which is an act to modify or end a sentence imposed by the court. Conditional pardons are rare as the Governor does not typically substitute their judgment for that of the courts. In order to be eligible for a conditional pardon, you must be currently incarcerated, and (iii) an absolute pardon may be granted when the Governor is convinced that the petitioner is innocent of the charge for which he or she was convicted. An absolute pardon is often a remedy of last resort.

Because the existing regulations use the term pardon without qualification it was unclear that when drafted the term referred only to an Absolute Pardon. In addition as the registry requires registration based upon conviction an expungement of a charge which resulted in a conviction is not eligible for removal.

On March 30, 2022, the Virginia State Police adopted final amended regulations for 19 VAC 30-170, Regulations Governing the Operation and Maintenance of the Sex Offender and Crimes Against Minors Registry as follows:

19VAC30-170-30 was amended by inserting the word "Absolute" in front of the word pardon and adding language to ensure that expungements of convictions are not eligible for removal from the registry.
