The present action amends Section 580 of the Regulations Governing the Licensure of School Personnel (8 VAC 20-21-10 et seq.) to align this section of the regulation with a recent change in the Code of Virginia. In 2004, the General Assembly amended § 22.1-298. D of the Code of Virginia to require the following: ". . . . In addition, the Board's licensure regulations shall also require that, on and after July 1, 2005, initial licensure for principals and other school leaders, as may be determined by the Board, be contingent upon passage of the School Leader's Licensure Assessment." Section 580 of the Board of Education's regulation is amended to state the exact language specified in the Code.
