The new regulation is an amendment to the existing regulations, Licensure Regulations for School Personnel (8 VAC 20-21). This amendment will establish an endorsement (teaching area) in American Sign Language available on licenses issued by the Virginia Board of Education.

The Virginia Board of Education approved the amendment to the Licensure Regulations for School Personnel to establish an endorsement in American Sign Language at its meeting on October 19, 2000.

<u>Code of Virginia</u>, Section 22.1-298. Regulations governing licensure states: "The Board of Education shall, by regulation, prescribe the requirements for the licensure of teachers. Such regulations shall include a requirement that every teacher seeking initial licensure take a professional teacher's assessment prescribed by the Board. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board may provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, to any person who does not meet this requirement or any other requirement for licensure by law. http://leg1.state.va.us/cgi-bin/legp504.exe?000+cod+22.1-298

The primary purpose for licensing teachers and other school personnel is to maintain standards of professional competence. The licensure regulations set forth competencies required of instructional personnel in Virginia. The Board of Education has approved the provision of three years of instruction in American Sign Language (ASL) for foreign language credit toward an advanced studies diploma. The Board of Education also requested licensure requirements of teachers of ASL. These requirements need to be incorporated into the current licensure regulations for school personnel to ensure that prospective teachers have met competencies to teach ASL as a foreign language credit.

Substance

The Board of Education approved a change in the current Licensure Regulations for School Personnel as a result of the Board's action to permit, at the local division's discretion, courses in American Sign Language (ASL) to count as foreign language credit toward an advanced studies diploma. A student may take three courses in ASL (Levels I, II, and III) for foreign language credit. As a result of this action, the requirements for teachers who teach ASL courses need to be established to ensure that students taking the courses are taught by qualified teachers. The proposed changes set forth the knowledge and competencies needed by teachers of such courses.

Issues

The Board of Education currently has a policy in place that permits, at local option, a school division to offer courses in ASL. The policy also permits the division, again at local option, to count the credit for such courses toward the requirements for graduation from high school.

The primary issue is that, because students take the ASL courses for high school credit, the courses should be taught by teachers that are qualified in a manner consistent with the licensure standards that apply to all other endorsement areas.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE LICENSURE REGULATONS FOR SCHOOL PERSONNEL TO ESTABLISH AN ENDORSEMENT IN AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE (ASL)

Summary of Comment:

The individual supports section 1 of the proposal; however, he states that there are several areas in section 2 of the proposed language that do not ensure that the candidate has demonstrated all of the competencies outlined in 1.a. Concerns and recommendations are as follows:

• The requirements outlined in 2.a., 2.b., and 2. c (1) (a) do ensure that the candidate for endorsement has demonstrated the competencies required in section 1. However, the remaining requirements outlined in 2.c (1) do not ensure the same. Unlike the minimum requirements necessary to attain Qualified and Professional certification provided through the American Sign Language Teachers Association (ASLTA), the requirements outlined in sub-paragraphs 2.c.(1) (b), (c), and (d) do not satisfy the competencies required of the candidate for endorsement found in section 1.a., sub-paragraphs (3), (4), and (5).

[For example, the Virginia Quality Assurance Screening (VQAS) is composed of two parts: 1) a written assessment, which solely tests the individual's knowledge and application of the Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf (RID) Code of Ethics; and 2) a performance assessment, which assesses an individual's strengths and weaknesses in interpreting from sign language to spoken English. The VQAS does not assess a candidate's competency in the "Knowledge of history, social structure and artistic and literary contributions of the Deaf culture," which is an appropriate requirement of the proposed regulations.]

• The individual is recommending that the requirements in sections 2.c. (1) (b), (c), and (d) be established as prerequisites for individuals who are serving as teachers of ASL and who have two years to meet the ASL requirements. In addition, it is recommended that these individuals meet the following prerequisites: (1) hold a current, valid provisional certification by the American Sign Language Teachers Association and (2) receive a rating of Advanced or higher on the Sign Communication Proficiency Interview.

In response to the above comments, the agency has determined that no change in the regulations is necessary. The agency determined that well-qualified persons are available as teachers of ASL who do not meet the additional requirements recommended in the public comment. Such persons have been employed in local school divisions for many years in the commonwealth. In addition, the statewide work force of available ASL teachers does not show sufficient numbers of teachers who have the additional credentials mentioned in the comment. Therefore, the agency determined that the suggestion made in the public comment (above) is unnecessarily burdensome and would have no appreciable impact on the quality of services rendered to schools and students. Thus, no change was made.
