Section 58.1-3661 of the Code of Virginia directs the Department of Environmental Quality to "promulgate regulations establishing criteria for recycling equipment, facilities, or devices." This regulation establishes standards, forms and procedures for the assessment of the equipment, facilities and devices for certification of local tax exemption. The Department of Environmental Quality previously adopted this regulation.

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State law directs the Department of Environmental Quality to adopt this regulation, therefore eliminating this regulation is not a viable alternative. The department considered amending this regulation, but rejected this alternative since the regulation, as currently written, is effective in achieving the purpose of the regulation.

No public comments were received. An informal advisory group was not formed to assist with this periodic review.

#### **Effectiveness**

Section 58.1-3661 of the Code of Virginia specifies that recycling machinery and equipment certified by the Department of Environmental Quality may be eligible for a local property tax exemption. Section 58.1-3661 of the Code of Virginia allows the governing body of any county, city or town to exempt or partially exempt qualifying machinery or equipment from local taxation. This regulation promulgated by the Department of Environmental Quality establishes the procedure and rules for the certification, to avoid confusion concerning equipment that is eligible for reduced tax rates. The regulation has been effective in protecting public health and welfare with the least possible cost and intrusiveness to the citizens and businesses of the Commonwealth, ensuring that certified recycling equipment is eligible for reduced tax rates.

The Department has determined that the regulation is clearly written and easily understandable by the individuals and entities affected. It is written so as to permit only one reasonable interpretation, is written to adequately identify the affected entity, and, insofar as possible, is written in non-technical language.

#### **Decision**

This regulation satisfies the provisions of state law and is effective in meeting its goals; therefore, the regulation is being retained without amendment.

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This regulation continues to be needed. It provides recycling facilities with criteria concerning equipment that is eligible for reduced tax rates.

No complaints or comments were received concerning the regulation from the public during the comment period.

The regulation's level of complexity is appropriate to ensure that the regulated entities are able to provide the necessary information for the department to review recycling equipment and certify it is eligible for reduced tax rates.

This regulation does not overlap, duplicate, or conflict with any state law or other state regulation. This regulation provides a means for persons (businesses) to claim a unique tax exemption for costs incurred for recycling equipment.

This regulation was last reviewed in 2017. Technology, economic conditions, and other factors have not changed in ways that would make this regulation less efficient and cost-effective in terms of protecting human health and the environment or meeting legal mandates.

The Department, through examination of the regulation, has determined that the regulatory requirements currently minimize the economic impact of these regulations on small businesses and thereby minimize the impact on existing and potential Virginia employers and their ability to maintain and increase the number of jobs in the Commonwealth. If small businesses purchase eligible recycling equipment, their tax rates assessed by the governing body of any county, city or town may be reduced.
