Section 15.1- 11.6 of the Code of Virginia authorizes a local government, at its option, to require boiler or pressure vessel operators to obtain an initial certification from the locality before engaging in the operation and maintenance of boilers and pressure vessels in that jurisdiction. This regulation provides a uniform statewide standard to determine ability, proficiency, and qualification of local certification applicants. This standard is for governing bodies of counties, cities and towns that have adopted ordinances requiring local certification. This regulation does not provide for state certification of boiler and pressure vessel operators.

The regulation provides a description of the examination for boiler operator certification including specific competencies and experience requirements for different levels of operators. It also includes a procedure for the locality to follow in certifying boiler operators and reasons for appeals.

Basis

The 1989 General Assembly of Virginia added Section 15.1- 11.6 to the Code of Virginia. This section became section 15.2-910. (Ordinance certifying boiler and pressure vessel operators; penalty) as a result of the revision and recodification of the laws pertaining to counties, cities and towns by the 1997 General Assembly. This section permits the governing bodies of counties, cities and towns to adopt ordinances which require certification of boilers and pressure vessel operators who engage in, or offer to engage in, for the general public for compensation, the operation or maintenance of a boiler or pressure vessel in such counties, cities or towns. The section requires the Safety and Health Codes Board to establish standards to be used in determining the ability, proficiency and qualifications of an applicant for certification under a local ordinance.

The legal authority mandates this regulation. The regulation does not exceed the minimum legal requirements of the state mandate.

No comments were received from the public during the public comment period. The agency and the Safety and Health Codes Board did not establish an informal advisory group for the purpose of assisting in the periodic review.

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The regulation has two goals:

- 1. To insure statewide uniformity in the determination of the ability, proficiency and qualifications of boiler and pressure operators certified under a local government ordinance.
- 2. The protection of the public's health, safety and welfare with the least possible cost and intrusiveness to the citizens and businesses of the Commonwealth.

The regulation is very effective in achieving these goals by providing uniform statewide criteria to be used by all counties, cities or towns who choose to regulate the certification of boiler and pressure vessel operators. It protects the citizens of the Commonwealth from the dangers of boiler or pressure vessels being operated in an unsafe manner or by an unqualified operator. The regulation has a positive impact on the institution of the family and family stability by protecting families from the operation of boiler and pressure vessels in an unsafe manner.

The regulation is clearly written and easily understandable. To date, no locality has adopted an ordinance which requires certification of boiler and pressure vessel operators under section 15.2-910 of the Code of Virginia. Should such an ordinance be adopted and this regulation implemented, the examination would be privatized to assure testing meets national standards.

Alternatives

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The regulation has a positive impact on the institution of the family and family stability by protecting families from the operation of boiler and pressure vessels in an unsafe manner. This regulation will have a direct effect on all families living in a locality that certifies boiler and pressure vessel operators. The regulation could possibly increase family income by encouraging boiler operators to acquire more training and become higher qualified boiler or pressure vessel operators. Thus the family income could possibly increase. The regulation also has a positive impact by improving operator skill levels, it encourages self-sufficiency and self-pride in operators. The regulation has no impact on the authority and rights of parents in the education, nurturing and supervision of their children or on the marital commitment.
