Regulations at Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations §273.16 require states to determine whether intentional program violations have occurred in the Food Stamp Program either through referral to a court of appropriate jurisdiction or through an administrative disqualification hearing. §63.1-124 of the Code of Virginia allows the State to determine whether intentional program violations have occurred either through an appropriate court referral or through an administrative disqualification hearing. §63.1-116, §63.1-117, and §63.1-119 of the Code of Virginia establish the role of the Commissioner of Social Services or the designee in the appeal process.

The regulation does not exceed federal minimal requirements.

The Office of the Attorney General has certified that the Department continues to have the authority to promulgate this regulation.

Alternatives

The Administrative Disqualification Hearings process is itself an alternative to local social services agencies pursuing action through courts to determine whether individuals have committed intentional actions against the Food Stamp Program. The agency has attempted to minimize the activities required through the hearing process so that the administrative process will be a reasonable alternative to local social services agencies instead of pursuing actions through the court system.

Effectiveness

This regulation does not protect public health or safety. Federal policies require states to determine whether individuals receive the correct amount of food stamp benefits and to refer to the court or through an administrative channel to determine when individuals commit intentional acts that violate the program's policies. This regulation establishes procedures for hearings to determine if individuals have committed acts against the Food Stamp Program. The provisions also seek to protect the rights of individuals and recipient households by requiring agencies to follow outlined procedures and to require hearing officers to examine presented evidence to determine that it is clear and convincing that regarding its intentionality.

Staff members of the Division of Benefit Programs and of the Office of the Attorney General have reviewed the regulation for clarity and understandability.
