**Federal Impact Monitoring Subcommittee Meeting**  
***DRAFT* Minutes**  
**Friday, October 17, 2025**

**I. Welcome and Subcommittee Purpose.** Freddy Mejia, CHIPAC Chair, welcomed the following members of the CHIPAC to the inaugural meeting of the *ad hoc* Federal Impact Monitoring Subcommittee at 11:01am:

- Joanna Fowler, Virginia Health Care Foundation – joined virtually (1A)
- Emily Moore, Voices for Virginia's Children (*CHIPAC Vice Chair*)

Victoria Richardson, Virginia Poverty Law Center, and Kelly Cannon, Virginia Hospital and Healthcare Association Foundation, not present for this inaugural meeting but will be part of the Subcommittee going forward.

The Subcommittee's purpose will be to monitor impacts of *H.R. 1* and federal executive branch actions that impact children's health insurance coverage. Mejia noted that some of these impacts will likely be secondary (e.g., *H.R. 1* provisions that impact parents enrolled in Medicaid Expansion, and/or those who are lawfully residing immigrants, may produce "trickle-down" effects to children).

Fowler suggested monitoring impacts from other health insurance affordability programs (e.g., Marketplace subsidies), given the potential for children and families to transition from those programs to Medicaid/FAMIS.

**II. Subcommittee Deliverable Discussion.** Mejia suggested the December 2026 CHIPAC meeting to report the Subcommittee's findings and potential recommendations to the full Committee, with potential for interim updates at quarterly meetings. Given the timing of the subsequent General Assembly session, the Subcommittee discussed a phased approach to delivering recommendations to the DMAS Director and/or Health & Human Resources Secretary, if recommendations indicate need for enacting legislation and/or appropriation.

**III. Future Subcommittee Meetings.** Future meetings of the Federal Impact Monitoring Subcommittee will be held immediately following the CHIPAC Executive Subcommittee meetings. A workplan will be developed at the January 2026 meeting, which may include an outside speaker to address solutions developed by other states in preparation for *H.R. 1* changes.

**IV. Public Comment.** One member of the public joined this inaugural meeting of the Federal Impact Monitoring Subcommittee. Mejia opened the floor for public comment. None was given. The meeting adjourned at 11:32.
