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2	The State Board of Elections ("the Board") meeting was held by electronic
3	communication on Friday, September 18, 2020. Robert Brink, Chairman, John
4	O'Bannon, Vice Chairman, and Jamilah LeCruise, Secretary, represented the State Board
5	of Elections ("the Board"). Christopher E. "Chris" Piper, Commissioner and Jessica
6	Bowman, Deputy Commissioner, represented the Department of Elections ("ELECT").
7	Carol Lewis and Heather Hays Lockerman represented the Office of the Attorney
8	General ("OAG"). Chairman Brink called the meeting to order at 1:01 P.M.
9	Chairman Brink informed the Board that on March 12, 2020, Governor Ralph S.
10	Northam declared that a state of emergency exists in the Commonwealth as the result of
11	the potential spread of COVID-19, a communicable disease presenting a threat to public
12	health. On March 30, 2020, the Governor issued an executive order requiring all
13	individuals in Virginia to remain at their place of residence, with certain enumerated
14	exceptions.

This meeting was conducted consistent with the requirements for electronic meetings by public bodies set forth in Items 4-0.01 of House Bills 29 and 30, as passed by the General Assembly ("GA") and signed by the Governor in April of this year. The purpose of the meeting is to transact the statutorily required business of the Board. Chairman Brink stated that the Board would receive public comments on agenda items prior to its action on that item, and an open public comment period would be offered prior to adjournment. 22	Friday, September 18, 2020 The first item of business was the approval of the minutes presented by Secretary
23	LeCruise. Vice Chair O'Bannon moved that the Board approve the minutes from the
24	April 3, 2020 Board meeting. Chairman Brink seconded the motion, and the motion
25	passed unanimously. A roll call vote was taken:

29	Vice Chair O'Bannon moved that the Board approve the minutes from the August 4,
30	2020 Board Meeting. Chairman Brink seconded the motion, and the motion passed

35	The next item of business was the Commissioner's Report presented by
36	Commissioner Piper. Commissioner Piper informed the Board that today starts the "45-
37	day" early voting and the deadline for all 133 localities to mail out absentee ballots. The
38	Commissioner informed the Board that he accompanied Governor Northam to the
39	Richmond General Registrars ("GR") office to vote. Commissioner Piper expressed his
40	appreciation to the 133 localities and the ELECT staff on preparing for early voting.
41	The Commissioner stated that the GA passed the no-excuse absentee early voting
42	period, allowing voters to vote in the November 2020 general election for 45 days prior

to November 3, 2020. Commissioner Piper informed the Board that as of September 17, 43

2020, there had been 840,000 absentee ballot requests. The Commissioner informed the 44 Board that during the special session, the bill passed to provide absentee voters prepaid 45 postage envelopes. Commissioner Piper stated that the absentee ballots mailed September 46 18 would contain a return prepaid postage envelope. The Commissioner stated that the 47 GA set aside two million dollars to reimburse the localities for the prepaid postage. 48 Commissioner Piper stated that the GA instituted a cure process for the ballot 49 envelopes. The Commissioner explained to the Board, that normally, if a voter failed to 50 provide certain information on the absentee ballot's internal envelope, it would be 51 rejected. The cure process allows the GR to contact the voter within three days via 52 53 phone, email, or letter, notifying them of the error and providing them an opportunity to correct the ballot or request a new ballot to submit. Commissioner Piper stated that in 54 June ELECT entered into a consent decree from the Virginia League of Woman Voters 55 for the removal of the witness signature on the return absentee ballot envelope. The 56 Commissioner stated that the consent decree was put into law by the GA during the 57 August session. Commissioner Piper stated if a voter is unable to provide a witness 58 signature safely, they are not required to do so, and informed the Board that local 59 elections officials (general registrars) were informed not to reject an absentee ballot based 60 on a voter's inability to provide a witness signature. 61 The Commissioner stated that during the August 8th Board Meeting the Board

The Commissioner stated that during the August 8th Board Meeting the Board adopted two requirements for absentee ballots: the requirement for all localities to place an intelligent mail barcode on the absentee ballot envelope to track the ballot through its mailing process, and the requirement that all ballots and envelope contain the Elections

Mail Insignia. Commissioner Piper stated that the Elections Mail Insignia is an identifier 66 for the United States Postal Service ("USPS") to recognize the envelope as official 67 Elections/(ELECT) mail and classify it as a high priority. The Commissioner informed 68 the Board that ELECT is in a partnership with the USPS regional team throughout this 69 Election. Commissioner Piper informed the Board that ELECT was also in a consent 70 decree to allow individuals with a print disability to safely and privately submit their 71 ballot to ELECT. 72 The Commissioner informed the Board that ELECT has started a *Democracy* 73 Defended media campaign and a Free to be Absentee promotional program. 74 Commissioner Piper stated that ELECT has provided these two PR campaigns to 75 highlight the elections security efforts provided by ELECT. The Commissioner informed 76 the Board that the PR campaigns and absentee program provides information to the 77 public on how to register to vote, early voting, how to safely cast a ballot, important 78 deadlines, etc. Commissioner Piper stated the elections security program called 79 Democracy Defended provides the public with an insight of what ELECT has been doing 80 to ensure the safety of the Election and remind voters that their votes are safe. The 81 Commissioner informed the Board that Democracy Defended also gives voters the 82 opportunity to sign up as an officer of election to serve at a local polling place. 83 Commissioner Piper added that Governor Northam's Chief of Staff, the Secretary of 84 Education, the National Guard and others have sent out information encouraging 85 students, faculty, and staff to sign up to serve as officers of election at their local polling 86 places. 87

The Commissioner then showed the Board with the video created by ELECT for 88 the Democracy Defended campaign. Commissioner Piper expressed his appreciation to 89 the ELECT team for the hard work put into the campaign. 90 The next item of business was the DEMTECH Electronic Pollbook Certification 91 presented by James Heo, Confidential Policy Advisor. This report is in the Working 92 Papers for the September 18, 2020 meeting. Vice Chair O'Bannon moved that the Board 93 certify the use of Centerpoint ePollTab 1.0 in elections in the Commonwealth of Virginia, 94 pursuant to the State Certification of Electronic Pollbook: Requirements and Procedures. 95 Secretary LeCruise seconded the motions, and the motion passed unanimously. A roll call 96 97 vote was taken: Chairman Brink – Aye 98 Vice Chair O'Bannon – Aye 99 Secretary LeCruise – Ave 100 Chairman Brink opened the floor to public comment. 101 The Chairman announced that the Board would go into Closed Session. At 1:30 102 P.M., Secretary LeCruise moved that the Board go into closed session for the purpose of 103 consultation with legal counsel and briefings by staff members or consultants for the 104 purpose of receiving legal advice, as authorized by Section 2.2-3711(A)(7) of the Code of 105 Virginia concerning the following ongoing legal matters: 106 Wilson v.
