# Approval of Minutes

**BOARD WORKING PAPERS** 

The State Board of Elections ("the Board") meeting was held by electronic 1 communication Wednesday, November 16, 2022. In attendance: Robert Brink, Chairman; John 2 O'Bannon, Vice Chairman; Georgia Alvis-Long, Secretary, Angela Chiang, and Delegate 3 Donald Merricks, members; represented the State Board of Elections ("the Board"). Susan J. 4 Beals, Commissioner, represented the Department of Elections ("ELECT"), and Joshua Lief and 5 Travis Andrews represented the Office of the Attorney General ("OAG"). Chairman Brink called 6 7 the meeting to order at 3:02 P.M. The first item of business was the approval of the minutes, presented by Secretary Alvis-8 Long. Vice Chair O'Bannon moved that the Board approve the minutes from the September 27, 9 2022 and November 8, 2022 Board Meeting. Ms. Chiang seconded the motion and the motion 10 passed unanimously. A roll call vote was taken: 11 12 Chairman Brink – Aye Vice Chair O'Bannon – Aye 13 Secretary Alvis-Long – Aye 14 Ms. Chiang – Aye 15 Delegate Merricks – Aye 16 The second item of business was the Commissioner's Report, presented by 17 Commissioner Beals. Commissioner Beals expressed her appreciation to the 133 General 18 Registrars, their staff and the 399 Electoral Board members across the Commonwealth for their 19 hard work and dedication during the Election. The Commissioner stated that each Electoral 20 Board conducted their canvas and gave individual consideration to numerous provisional ballots 21 resulting from same day registration. Commissioner Beals stated that ELECT is required by law 22

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to conduct a Risk Limiting Audit for the Election. The Commissioner stated that the Board adopted the ballot polling method as the chosen method all localities will use to ensure uniformity across the state.

Commissioner Beals informed the Board that ELECT is reviewing its list maintenance practices and examining the data exchange procedures that are in place with other agencies. The Commissioner stated that ELECT is preparing the Post-Election Report and plans to present it during the January board meeting. Commissioner Beals advised the Board that November 17<sup>th</sup> kicks off the start of the new statewide voter registration system meeting.

The third item of business was the Selection Races for the Risk Limiting Audits for the November 2022 General Elections, presented by Karen Hoyt-Stewart, Locality Security (Voting Tech) Program Manager and Rachel Lawless, Confidential Policy Advisor. *This memo is in the Working Papers for the November 16, 2022 Meeting.* Chairman Brink conducted the random selection for the Risk Limiting Audit, and House District 9 was selected. Vice Chair O'Bannon moved *that the Board randomly draw a U.S House of Representative contest to determine the participants of the risk-limiting audit required by the Code of Virginia § 24.2-671.2(C)(1).* Ms. Chiang seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously. Ms. Scott 47 informed the Board that she, Andrea Walker, Brian Tynes, and Avonda Turner will be rolling the 48 ten-sided dice to generate the random seed number. Re: Summary of the Department's efforts to present election results to the State Board of Elections for

Certification

**Applicable Code Sections:** §§ 24.2-675, 24.2-679, 24.2-680 and 24.2-948.2.

Background: In preparation for this State Board of Elections meeting, at which election results from the 2022 November General Election will be certified, staff members at the Department of Elections (ELECT) complete a number of verification procedures to ensure that all relevant election data entered into the Virginia Election and Registration System (VERIS) by the localities accurately reflects what happened on Election Day (§ 24.2-679). ELECT staff verifies that voter turnout and provisional voter turnout values have been entered for each precinct. When voter turnout has not been entered by a locality, ELECT staff asks for the voter turnout to be entered by the locality as quickly as possible. ELECT staff verifies that a locality's abstract vote totals for each candidate match the election results that have been entered into VERIS. When the voter turnout and election results have been entered, ELECT staff runs several VERIS election results error check reports to verify the accuracy of the local data entered. When a corrected abstract is needed through this error review process, ELECT staff requests that the locality complete an amended abstract per § 24.2-675. This verification by ELECT staff positions the State Board to better understand the election results reported by each jurisdiction.

ELECT staff also prepares a written statement document for the Board Members to sign once the abstract totals have been read and confirmed to be accurately reflected on the written statement.

ELECT staff also prepares certificates of elections for those winners. After the election results are

ELECT staff must review the requirements of § 24.2-948.2, if applicable, before issuing certificates to the successful candidates.

**Re:** Results of the 2022 Risk-Limiting Audit for the November 2022 General Election

### Applicable Code Section:

§24.2-672.2

### Summary:

Pursuant to §24.2-672.2, the U.S. House of Representatives 9<sup>th</sup> District was chosen at random at the State Board of Election meeting held on November 16, 2022. The audit was completed on November 29, 2022. The results indicated that there was a .0000004864% chance that the audit of the U.S House of Representatives 9<sup>th</sup> District contest was inaccurate, providing election officials with strong evidence and confidence in the reported outcome of the election.

### 2022 RLA General Overview:

ELECT announced that the RLA would begin Monday, November 28<sup>th</sup> and, in conjunction with the localities located in the U.S. House of Representatives 9<sup>th</sup> District, established the location, time and date for the RLA public meetings. ELECT's notice was posted on ELECT's website on Monday, November 21<sup>st</sup> and details were also published locally.

Twenty-eight localities are located in the 9<sup>th</sup> District and participated in the audit; these localities include the following counties and cities:

- *The Counties of* Bedford, Bland, Buchanan, Carroll, Craig, Dickenson, Floyd, Franklin, Giles, Grayson, Henry, Lee, Montgomery, Patrick, Pulaski, Roanoke, Russell, Scott, Smyth, Tazewell, Washington, Wise, and Wythe.
- The Cities of Bristol, Galax, Martinsville, Norton, and Radford.

Localities were able to begin uploading their ballot manifests on Friday, November 18, 2022. Localities finished uploading ballot manifest on Monday, November 21<sup>st</sup> and the audit was launched the same day. 60 ballots were pulled for the 9<sup>th</sup> District. Upon the audit launch, it was determined that eight (8) localities were complete; the software determined the localities did not have to pull any ballots for the audit. The localities were: *the counties of* Bland, Buchanan, Craig, Dickenson, Russell and Scott as well as *the cities of* Bristol and Norton.

The remaining localities logged into the ARLO, the software used to perform all statistical calculations and manage the data of the audit, to download their audit materials. The audits took place on November 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. There was no need for a second round, and the audit was completed on November 29, 2022. The audit results for the U.S. House of Representatives 9<sup>th</sup> District concluded with strong evidence and confidence in the reported outcome of the election.

Pursuant to §24.2-672.2, ELECT will present a full report of the 2022 November Risk-Limiting Audit at the January 18, 2023 SBE meeting.

### Suggested Motion

I move that the State Board of Elections submit the proposed regulation, 1VAC20-20-90, for consideration under the Virginia Administrative Process Act.

#### **Executive Summary**

As per the Code of Virginia §24.2-410.2 Security of the Virginia Voter Registration System, the State Board of Elections is required to "promulgate regulations and standards necessary" to ensure the security of the Virginia voter registration system (VERIS). This law also requires the Department of Elections to limit access to VERIS to address and resolve security risks, or enforce compliance with the Locality Election Security Standards.

Last, as per its charter, the Voter Registration System Security (VRSS) Advisory Group is obligated to provide recommendations and insight to heighten the security of VERIS and supporting technologies. The VRSS also recommends the State Board of Elections enact a regulation requiring that all VERIS users be required to participate in a Security Awareness Training program provided by their locality compliant with ELECT specifications, or participate in the no-cost to localities Security Awareness Training program provided by ELECT.

### **Proposed Regulation Text**

1 VAC 20-20-90 Required Training for Virginia voter registration system users

Access to the Virginia voter registration system will be restricted to individuals enrolled in a security awareness training program approved or provided by the Virginia Department of Elections. Individuals who do not complete assigned training within the required timeframe may have their credentials revoked or limited as needed to ensure the security of the Virginia voter registration system.

Statutory Authority §24.2-410.2 of the Code of Virginia.

### **Suggested Motion**

I move that the Board approve the proposed Delegations of Authority 2022 from the State Board of Elections to the Department of Elections, pursuant to the Virginia Administrative Process Act, and I further move that all prior Delegations of Authority be rescinded.

### **Delegations Background**

The State Board of Elections ("SBE') is authorized to prescribe standard forms for voter registration and elections, and to supervise, coordinate, and adopt regulations governing the work of local electoral boards, registrars, and officers of election. The Department of Elections ("ELECT") is authorized to establish and maintain a statewide automated voter registration system to include procedures for ascertaining current addresses of registrants; to require cancellation of records for registrants no longer qualified; to provide electronic application for voter registration and absentee ballots; and to provide electronic delivery of absentee ballots to eligible military and overseas voters. The ELECT conducts the SBE's administrative and programmatic operations and discharges the SBE's duties consistent with delegated authority.

### **Needed Revisions**

The current version of Delegation of Authorities was adopted in 2022. The following documents reflect additions from the 2022 Legislative Sessions. Included with this packet are separate supporting memos for each chapter outlining changes to the delegations regarding new Code provisions that did not exist in 2021 (divided into sections of those which should be delegated to ELECT and those that should remain with the SBE). The information provided also includes copies of the new versions as recommended by ELECT.
