**PUBLIC COMMENT:** Dallice Joyner, Executive Director, Northern Virginia AHEC, presented public comment in favor of regulating the profession of medical interpreters.

Cornelius Scott, Army Reserves, representing the profession of Surgical Technicians, presented comment in favor of regulating the profession of Surgical Technicians.

Robert Ronner, M.D., President of the Academy of Sleep Medicine spoke in favor of regulating the profession of Polysomnographers. Additionally, he noted that an extensive written response to the seven criteria for licensure is forthcoming to Mr. Crow.

Rebecca Music, VCSA, Surgical Technologist, presented a power point presentation and spoke in favor of the need for regulating the profession.

Daniel Baird, NSAA/VASA, presented comment in favor of regulating the profession of Surgical Technologists.

Catherine Sparkman, AST, presented comment in favor of regulating the profession of Surgical Technologists.

Mary Armstrong, VCSA of AST, presented comment in favor of regulating the profession of Surgical Assistants.

Theresa Cooper, VCSA, presented comment in favor of regulating the profession of Surgical Technologists.

David Jennette, MD, CSA, representing the non-physician surgical assistants presented comment in favor of regulating the profession of Surgical Assistants. Mark Pulson, CSA, presented comment in favor of regulating the profession of Surgical Assistants.

R. Clinton Crews, Director of Surgical Assistant Program, National Board, presented comment in favor of regulating the profession of Surgical Assistants.

Alicia Beech, Member of AST and trained by St. Mary's Hospital, presented comment in favor of regulating the profession. Additionally, she requested that the Committee consider the issue of "grandfathering" in its study.

Karry Simons, licensed Surgical Technologist/Assistant in MD, spoke in favor of regulating Surgical Assistants and Technologists.

Henry Jacobs, Independent Surgical Assistant, spoke in favor of regulating Surgical Assistants. Additionally, he requested that the Committee consider the issue of "grandfathering" in its study.

Scott Sprouse, VASA/ASA and employer of Surgical Assistants, spoke in favor of regulating Surgical Assistants.

It was noted that the American College of Surgeons had passed a resolution in support of the regulation of Surgical Assistants and Surgical Technologists. Additionally, it was noted that Registered Nurses are not trained as Surgical Assistants or Surgical Technologists.
