PUBLIC COMMENT: There was no public comment.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Meeting minutes from February 14, 2012 were approved by

motion of Ms. Gregory and properly seconded by Dr. Levin, all

members were in favor, none opposed.

BOARD ORIENTATION:

Introduction of all Board members were made and a warm welcome to our newest members, Dr. Farquhar, and Ms. Van de Water.

DEPARTMENT DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Dr. Reynolds-Cane gave a brief overview of the September 26, 2012 Strategic Planning meeting held by the Virginia Health Workforce Development Authority, of which she is a member, and the Healthcare Workforce Data Center is also actively involved. Dr. Reynolds-Cane attended the September 29, 2012 Virginia Nurses Foundation Gala at the Jefferson Hotel. In attendance were Delegate John O'Bannon and Secretary Bill Hazel as the Honorary Chair for the evening. DHP's Prescription Monitoring Program was selected by the National Governors Association (NGA) to receive a year-long \$45,000 competitive grant to participate in an NGA sponsored Prescription Drug Abuse Reduction Policy Academy. The New Board Member Orientation program was held September 27, 2012 and was a success.

LEGISLATIVE/REGULATORY UPDATE:

Ms. Yeatts provided handouts of the current Regulatory Actions by Board and legislation of the 2012 General Assembly. (Attachment 1)

AGENCY COMMUNICATIONS & EDUCATION:

Ms. Powers discussed the importance of media relations and the press and how Communications responds to media requests. Ms. Powers informed the Board of the savings that have been achieved by the implementation of the PolyCom video conferencing system that has been utilized by the Enforcement Division and several other Boards to date. Working in conjunction with the Healthcare Workforce Data Center, Communications is currently in the planning phase of a panel discussion entitled "New Frontiers for Virginia's Healthcare Workforce". This panel discussion will involve the release of three workforce reports on Pharmacy, Nursing and Dentistry.

COMMITTEE REPORT:

Regulatory Research Committee

Dr. Noble reported that the Perfusionist study is moving forward and the next step is for the Committee to receive public comment on the profession.

The Pharmacy Scope of Practice & Team Delivery study is being continued in deference to the General Assembly's action on potential legislation under development by the Virginia Pharmacist Association and Medical Society of Virginia. The Committee is not privy to specific language under consideration at this time.

Nominating Committee

Dr. Carter presented the meeting minutes from the September 27, 2012 Nominating Committee meeting. The Committee nominated the following individuals as their slate of officers for the position of Chair and Vice Chair of the Board of Health Professions; Dr. Jonathan Noble, Chair and Irene V. Farquhar as Vice Chair.

A motion was made by Dr. Levin and properly seconded by Mr. Rhodes to accept the nomination of Dr. Jonathan Noble as Board Chair, and Irene Farquhar as Board Vice Chair. All members were in favor, none opposed.

PRACTITIONER SELF REFERRAL

The proposal put forth by Tidewater Kidney Specialists, Inc. "TKS" was reviewed by Administrative Proceedings, Board Counsel, Board Acting Chair, Dr. Noble and agency subordinate. The Advisory Opinion indicates that the proposal provided by Tidewater Kidney Specialists, Inc., does not conflict with the Act. Motion was made by Dr. Farquhar and properly seconded by Ms. Markva. All Board members were in favor.

BOARD REPORTS:

Board of Medicine

Dr. Farquhar stated that the disciplinary process is an eye opening event. She is perplexed as to why Behavioral Analysts were placed under the Board of Medicine.

Board of Pharmacy

Mr. Rhodes stated that there is potential for scope of practice changes as well as possible changes to the educational requirements for pharmacy technicians. There is currently a 4:1 ratio of pharmacy technicians to pharmacists. He stated that the workforce reports created by the Healthcare Workforce Data Center are very helpful.

Board of Counseling

Ms. Markva stated that changes to Medicaid have made it necessary for licensure requirements to change, which has made it very difficult on the profession.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Bylaws

Dr. Carter would like the Board of Health Professions bylaws amended to read: "The Board shall meet at least one time per year on a date at the discretion of the Board."

Motion was made by Dr. Levin and properly seconded by Ms. Markva to amend the bylaws as stated by Dr. Carter. All members were in favor.

BHP Budget

Dr. Carter reported that the Board of Health Professions' expenditures for the 2012 year closeout were at 83% due largely to reduced travel-related expenses.

CY2013 Board Work Plan

Dr. Carter reviewed the 2013 Board Work Plan. (Attachment 2)

A motion was made by Ms. Gregory and properly seconded by Dr. Farquhar to set the 2013 meeting dates as noted. All members were in favor.

Medical Assistants

Dr. Carter reviewed a letter sent by Katherine Garbarino requesting a study of the need for regulation of medical assistants. After Board review, it was recommended that the request be sent back to the Regulatory Research Committee to obtain additional information regarding the study.

A motion was made by Dr. Levin and properly seconded by Mr. Rhodes to send the study request back to the Regulatory Research Committee for additional information. All members were in favor.

Military Study

Dr. Carter discussed that staff will be coordinating on the development of a draft website for DHP dedicated to providing information relative to military service member, military spouses, and veterans. There will be information on relevant statutes and licensure requirements and links to the key Commonwealth websites for services and information relating to educational, training, employment, and other issues of significance. It was noted that VDH is already implementing a expedited pathways for medics to attain Virginia EMT and Paramedic certification.

Dr. Noble advised the Board that he would be making appointments to the Board Committees and those appointed would be notified by an email from Ms. Jackson.
