The Board met by conference call to receive information in order to determine whether Ms.

Cannon's continued practice of veterinary technology constitutes a substantial danger to public health and safety. Mr. Halbleib presented the details of the case to the Board for its consideration.

CLOSED SESSION:

On properly seconded motion by Ms. Singleton, the Board recessed Open Session and convened in Closed Session pursuant to §2.2-3711(A)(27) of the Code for the purpose of deliberation to reach a decision in the matter of **Dianna S. Cannon, LVT**. Additionally, it was moved that Howard Casway, Leslie Knachel and Terri Behr attend the Closed Session because their presence was deemed necessary and would aid the Board in its deliberations. Having certified that the matters discussed in the preceding Closed Session met the requirements of §2.2-3712 of the Code, the Board reconvened in Open Session and announced its decision.

DECISION:

On properly seconded motion by Dr. Gottschalk, the Board voted 6-0 by roll call vote that based upon the testimony and evidence presented, the continued practice of veterinary technology by Dianna S. Cannon, LVT constitutes a substantial danger to the public's health and safety and warrants the summary suspension of Ms. Cannon's license to practice veterinary technology in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

On properly seconded motion by Dr. Gottschalk, the Board voted 6-0 by roll call vote to offer Ms. Cannon a Consent Order in lieu of a Formal Administrative Hearing for indefinite suspension of her license to practice veterinary technology. The suspension shall be stayed upon proof of entry in the Health Practitioner's Monitoring Program and Ms. Cannon remaining compliant thereafter. Any violation of the order would be grounds for the rescission of the stayed suspension.
