Association, asking that the Board set up an Ad

Hoc Committee to help draft information

regarding sedation and standards for approving

training programs.

STATEMENT FROM MS. RYALS: Ms. Ryals described her meeting with Secretary

Tavener and she requested that the Board expedite the formulation of regulations for equine dental technicians. Secretary Tavener expressed the urgency for allowing this occupation to legally practice in Virginia.

EQUINE DENTAL TECHNICIANS: SEDATION ISSUE:

Scotti Russell, Executive Director of the Board of Pharmacy, addressed the Board regarding the use of sedation by technicians and the owners of the horses. Ms. Russell stated that all prescription drugs are controlled substances. She stated that the veterinarian could write a prescription for a sedative which could either be filled at a pharmacy or the veterinarian could dispense directly to the owner. The owner could administer to his own horse, with the exception of sedation drugs that are listed in the Drug Control Act. Drugs cannot be dispensed to an entire herd. It must be written for a specific animal.

FAST TRACK REGULATIONS:

Ms. Yeatts distributed the draft regulations for equine dental technicians (attachment II).

18 VAC 150-20-30

On properly seconded motion by Dr. Froeling, the Board voted unanimously to accept this section as proposed in the handout.

18 VAC 150-20-100

On properly seconded motion by Ms. Blackwell, the Board voted unanimously to accept this section as proposed in the handout.

18 VAC 150-20-140

On properly seconded motion by Dr. Froeling, the Board voted unanimously to amend #2 to read "Practicing veterinary medicine, or equine dentistry, where an unlicensed person has the authority to control the professional judgment of the licensed veterinarian."

On properly seconded motion by Dr. Froeling, the Board voted unanimously to accept this section as amended.

18 VAC 150-20-220

Some discussion took place on this section. It was stated that criteria has not been established for B.2, which deals with completion of a Board approved training program. It was also stated that the law prohibits veterinary technicians from practicing equine dentistry. Ms. Singleton asked

if veterinary technicians will have to complete subsections A & B of this section and was told by Ms. Yeatts that they would. It was also discussed that subsection A should be amended to add that when a veterinarian attests to having observed the equine dental applicant practicing, it must be the immediately preceding five years. On properly seconded motion by Dr. Froeling, the Board voted unanimously to accept this section

On properly seconded motion by Dr. Froeling, the Board voted unanimously to accept this section as proposed.

with the amendment to subsection A as stated

On properly seconded motion by Dr. Froeling, the Board voted unanimously to amend Section C.

On properly seconded motion by Dr. Froeling, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the fast tract regulations on equine dentistry as amended.

SUMMARY SUSPENSION:

Mr. Halblieb, Assistant Attorney General presented information relating to **Jack A. Cochrane, DVM.**

On properly seconded motion by Dr. Froeling, the Board recessed Open Session and convened in Closed Session pursuant to §2.2-3711(A)(28) of the Code of Virginia for the purpose of deliberation to reach a decision in the matter regarding Jack A. Cochrane, DVM. Additionally, it was moved that Elizabeth Young, Executive Director, and Jeanette Mead, Administrative Assistant, attend the closed meeting because their presence in the closed meeting was deemed necessary and would aid the Board in its deliberations. Having certified that the matters discussed in the preceding closed session met the requirements of §2.2-3712 of the Code, the Committee reconvened in open session and announced its decision.

On properly seconded motion by Dr. Froeling, the Board voted unanimously to suspend the license of **Jack A. Cochrane**, **DVM**, and to notice him for a Formal Hearing on August 8, 2007.
