Extending the Scenic Designation:

The Scenic River program requirements appear in several places on their web page. The "Guide to Citizen Involvement in the Scenic River Designation Process" an overview of the steps. <u>https://www.dcr.virginia.gov/recreational-planning/document/srcitguide.pdf</u>

There are several criteria which must be evaluated:

- Stream corridor vegetation
- Streambed or stream flow modifications
- Human development of visual corridor
- Historic Features
- Landscape
- Quality of fishery
- Additional natural features such as rare, threatened or endangered species
- Water quality
- Parallel roads
- Crossings
- Special features affecting aesthetics
- Recreational access
- Significant permanent protection (land conservation)

Before a river or river segment can be designated, DCR staff must conduct a study to determine if it qualifies for scenic river status. For a river segment to be studied, it must:

- Be at least 5 miles long.
- Be publically accessible or listed in a standard canoeing guide.
- Have identifiable start and end points.

The scenic river designation process considers the perceived remoteness of the river corridor. Because many of Virginia's rivers were major transportation routes, roads often followed the rivers. How

visible the roads are is key to a high rating in the parallel roads category.

Loudoun County Zoning Re-Write: Maura Walsh-Copeland provided a detailed presentation on the Zoning rewrite process and how the Scenic River Committee can engage in the process. Comments (email, online or webform) are due July 18, 2022.

Other: Waterford 2033 - Waterford Citizens Association, in partnership with the Waterford Foundation, is launching a Vision and Community Planning effort. Extension of Scenic River designation may be important to this effort.
