COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITY BOARD TRAINING PROGRAM REVIEW COMMITTEE MEETING

MINUTES OF MEETING

The Training Program Review Committee of the Common Interest Community Board met on Wednesday, June 2, 2010, at the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (DPOR), 9960 Mayland Drive, 2nd Floor, Board Room 4, Richmond, Virginia 23233.

The following members were present:

Committee member Ronda S. DeSplinter was not in attendance.

Steven Jack from the Office of the Attorney General was not present.

Mr. Kleine, Chair, called the meeting to order at 1:09 p.m.

Call to Order

Ms. Coerse moved to approve the agenda. Mr. Ahlberg seconded the Approval of Agenda motion which was unanimously approved by: Kleine, Sterling, Coerse, and Ahlberg.

Mr. Kleine opened the floor for public comment. No members of the Public Comment public present requested to speak.

Period

Mr. Perry provided the Committee members with a brief overview of Staff Overview of the training program review process. He proceeded to give a brief Approval Process overview of the three applications submitted for approval. Mr. Perry reminded the Committee that this Committee and the Board will be establishing precedence in reviewing future applications, and in recommending approval or denial of training program applications to the Board.

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Ms. Trigiani arrived at 2:00 p.m. Since she is an instructor for Ms. Trigiani Community Associations Institute, she recused herself during the review Recused of both CAI's applications.

Mr. Kleine indicated he serves as an exam proctor for Community Associations Institute, but felt he could be fair and provide impartial judgment in reviewing Community Associations Institute's applications as he is not involved in grading or reviewing any exam content.

The Committee reviewed the application from Community Associations Review of Institute (CAI), M-100: The Essentials of Community Association Introductory Management, for approval as an Introductory Training Program.

Training Program CAI: M-100

Jacob Gold and Dave Jennings were present as representatives of CAI to address concerns and answer any questions from the Committee. They informed the Committee that all "manager" instructors have completed and passed the examination for the M-100 training program. Their instructors are required to have teaching experience and have a wide diversity of practical experience. In answering questions regarding the examination, Mr. Gold indicated that multiple versions of the examination were utilized.

The Committee requested that Mr. Gold and Mr. Jennings provide statistics regarding the number of individuals who have completed the M-100 program, but have not obtained the Certified Manager of Community Associations designation.

Upon thorough review of the application, Ms. Coerse moved that the Committee recommend Board approval of the M-100 as an Introductory Training Program as submitted with a retroactive approval date of January 1, 2003. Mr. Ahlberg seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Kleine, Sterling, Coerse, and Ahlberg. Ms. Trigiani was not present during the discussion.

The Committee reviewed the application from the Institute of Real Review of Estate Management (IREM), Common Interest Developments: Introductory Managing Condominium Association Properties (CID 201), for Training Program approval as an Introductory Training Program.

IREM: CID 201

Vera McPherson was present as a representative of IREM to address concerns and answer any questions from the Committee. She informed the Committee that IREM attempts to utilize local instructors, and that all instructors are required to complete and pass the examination of any

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course they are teaching.

Upon thorough review of the application, Mr. Sterling moved that the Committee recommend Board approval of the CID 201 as an Introductory Training Program as submitted with a retroactive approval date of January 1, 2007. Ms. Coerse seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Kleine, Sterling, Coerse, and Ahlberg.

The Committee reviewed the application from Community Associations Review of Institute, PCAM Coursework, for approval as a Comprehensive Comprehensive Training Program.

Training Program CAI: PCAM

The Committee requested that Mr. Gold and Mr. Jennings provide Coursework statistics regarding the number of individuals who have completed the PCAM coursework, but have not obtained the PCAM designation.

Upon thorough review of the application, Ms. Coerse moved that the Committee recommend Board approval of the PCAM Coursework as a Comprehensive Training Program as submitted with a retroactive approval date of January 1, 2000. Mr. Sterling seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Kleine, Sterling, Coerse, and Ahlberg. Ms. Trigiani was not present during the discussion.

As a result of reviewing these three applications, the Committee Concerns and recommends that the Board consider regulatory changes which:

Recommendations

- Incorporate time allocations for each subject area.
- Include environmental issues as an additional subject area.
- Require instructors to be familiar with Virginia laws and regulations related to common interest community management.
- Require a state-specific training component as an entry requirement for certification that would cover Virginia statutes related to common interest communities as well as the Board's regulations.

Mr. Kleine thanked the Committee members for their work in reviewing June 3, 2010 Board these three applications.

Meeting

Ms. Henshaw said that the Committee's recommendations will be presented at the June 3, 2010 Board meeting. The next Committee meeting will be held on Monday, September 27 at 1:00 p.m. if any further applications are received.
