### Approval of Minutes

BOARD WORKING PAPERS Secretary LeCruise

The State Board of Elections ("the Board") meeting was held on Monday, 2 November 16, 2020, in Conference Room C, D, and E of the James Monroe Building. 3 The meeting was also conducted electronically so the public could view and hear the 4 meeting. In attendance: Robert Brink, Chairman, John O'Bannon, Vice Chairman, and 5 Jamilah LeCruise, Secretary, represented the State Board of Elections ("the Board"). 6 Christopher E. "Chris" Piper, Commissioner and Jessica Bowman, Deputy 7 Commissioner, represented the Department of Elections ("ELECT") and Carol Lewis 8 represented the Office of the Attorney General ("OAG"). Chairman Brink called the 9 meeting to order at 1:03 P.M. 10 Chairman Brink informed the Board that on March 12, 2020, Governor Ralph S. 11 Northam declared that a state of emergency exists in the Commonwealth as the result of 12 the potential spread of COVID-19, a communicable disease presenting a threat to public 13 health. On March 30, 2020, the Governor issued an executive order requiring all 14 individuals in Virginia to remain at their place of residence, with certain enumerated 15 exceptions. 16 This meeting was conducted consistent with the requirements for electronic 17 meetings by public bodies set forth in Items 4-0.01 of House Bills 29 and 30, as passed 18 by the General Assembly ("GA") and signed by the Governor in April of this year. The 19 purpose of the meeting is to transact the statutorily required business of the Board. 20 Chairman Brink stated that the Board would receive public comments on agenda items 21

prior to its action on that item; an open public comment period would be offered prior to 22 23 adjournment. The Chairman explained that due to not receiving the abstract results from the Richmond Registrars' office, the Board would reconvene the certification on 24 Wednesday, November 18, 2020. 25 26 The first item on the agenda was the approval of the minutes presented by Secretary LeCruise. Vice Chair O'Bannon moved that the Board approve the minutes 27 from the October 20, 2020 Board meeting. Chairman Brink seconded the motion and the 28 29 motion passed unanimously. A roll call vote was taken: 30 Chairman Brink – Aye 31 Vice Chair O'Bannon – Aye 32 Secretary LeCruise – Aye The next item of business was the Commissioner's Report presented by 33 Commissioner Piper. The Commissioner stated that the City of Richmond informed 34 ELECT that due to lack of staffing caused by Coronavirus, the abstracts would not be 35 available until Tuesday, November 17, 2020. Commissioner Piper expressed his 36 appreciation to all that assisted and participated in the November 3, 2020 election. The 37 Commissioner stated that prior to Election Day, 1.8 million voters participated in 38 absentee early in-person voting, and 1.1 million voted early by mail. Commissioner Piper 39 informed the Board that for the 2016 Election, the total number of absentee ballots cast 40 prior to the election was 566,000. 41 The Commissioner explained to the Board that ballots were still coming in on 42 Election Day and received through the mail up to Friday, November 6, 2020, at noon. 43

Commissioner Piper stated there were 2.8 million total number of absentee ballots cast in-person on Election Day and 3.5 million in 2016. The Commissioner informed the Board that ELECT's goal was to ensure that Virginians could vote safely. Commissioner Piper informed the Board that Virginia had nearly 6 million registered voters in 2020, up from 5.5 million in 2016. The Commissioner stated that the turnout for registered voters from the 2016 election compared to the 2020 election increased by approximately 74%. After the certification, the results can be confirmed. Commissioner Piper stated that on Election Day, there were no major issues and minor "hiccups." The Commissioner informed the Board that ELECT would be providing a Post-Election Report from the election once the certification is completed. 

Commissioner Piper informed the Board that Virginia has numerous safeguards to ensure the integrity of the election. The Commissioner explained that Virginia has strict certification standards that each voting machine must pass. The voting machine must pass a federal certification from The United States Election Assistance Commission and pass the Commonwealth of Virginia certification test. Commissioner Piper stated that earlier this year, the Board passed the requirement that electronic pollbooks must be tested prior to deployment on Election Day. The Commissioner stated that the same process allows accuracy testing for all voting machines in every locality. Commissioner Piper informed the Board that Virginia allows authorized representatives from the parties to be in place at polling places and during canvases. The Commissioner expressed his appreciation to see over 20,000 people sign up to be election officers.

Vice Chair O'Bannon asked the Commissioner if the Dominion system was used 65 during this election. The Commissioner explained that every voting machine goes 66 through logic and accuracy testing. Commissioner Piper informed the Board that the 67 voting machines are then sealed until Election Day. The Commissioner stated that 68 Virginia uses the Dominion 4.14e version in 29 localities. Secretary LeCruise asked how 69 many volunteers typically sign up to be Election Officers for a Presidential Election. 70 Commissioner Piper stated that volunteers can sign up when they register to vote or go to 71 the elections website. He explained that Virginia had over 20,000 volunteers in the 72 73 system. Chairman Brink opened the floor to public comment. Nicholas Smith addressed 74 the Board. 75 The next item of business was the Certification of the November 3, 2020, General 76 and Special Elections presented by Paul Saunders, Elections Administration Supervisor. This 77 report is in the Working Papers for the November 16, 2020 meeting. Chairman Brink 78 asked how many of the localities submitted their abstracts on time. Mr. Saunders stated 79 that 132 out of 133 localities had submitted their abstracts on time. Vice Chair O'Bannon 80 stated that the Virginia Republican Party's Chairman is sending a letter requesting to 81 delay the certification. The Vice Chair moved that the Board defer the item until after the 82 Closed Session. 83 At 1:40 P.M., Chairman Brink moved that the Board go into closed session for the 84 purpose of discussing protocols for maintaining the security of the Virginia voter 85 registration system and the supporting technologies utilized to maintain and record 86

registrant information, as discussion of such matters in open meeting would compromise 87 the security of the Virginia voter registration system, as authorized by Sections 2.2-88 3711(A)(34) and 24.2-410.2(E) of the Code of Virginia. Christopher Piper. 89 Commissioner of Elections, Jessica Bowman, Deputy Commissioner of Elections, Daniel 90 Persico, Chief Information Officer, Franchelle Tyson, Administrative Program Specialist 91 of the Department of Elections, and Carol Lewis of the Office of the Attorney General 92 will attend the closed session because their presence will reasonably aid the Board in its 93 consideration of the subject of the meeting. Secretary LeCruise seconded the motion and 94 95 the motion passed unanimously. A roll call vote was taken: Chairman Brink – Aye 96 Vice Chair O'Bannon – Aye 97 Secretary LeCruise – Aye 98 At 2:29 P.M., Vice Chair O'Bannon moved to reconvene in open session, and take 99 a roll call vote certifying that to the best of each member's knowledge, (i) only such 100 public business matters lawfully exempted from open meeting requirements under this 101 chapter and (ii) only such public business matters as were identified in the motion by 102 which the closed meeting was concerned were heard, discussed, or considered. ### **Suggested Motion For A Board Member To Make:**

"After reviewing the Abstract of Votes Cast in the January 5, 2021 Special Elections for Member, House of Delegates District 2 and Member, House of Delegates District 90, I move that the Board certify the results as presented and declare the winners."

### **Applicable Code Sections:**

• Va. Code § 24.2-679.

A. "... The Board shall... make statements of the whole number of votes given... The Board members shall certify the statements to be correct and sign the statements. The Board shall then determine those persons who received the greatest number of votes and have been duly elected to each office. The Board members shall endorse and subscribe on such statements a certificate of their determination."

- B. "The State Board shall meet as soon as possible after it receives the returns for any special election held at a time other than the November general election to ascertain the results of the special election in the manner prescribed in subsection A."
- Va. Code § 24.2-680.

"Subject to the requirements of § 24.2-948.2, the State Board shall without delay complete and transmit to each of the persons declared to be elected a certificate of his election, certified by it under its seal of office... The names of members elected to the General Assembly shall be certified by the State Board to the clerk of the House of Delegates or Senate, as appropriate."

### Background:

- The House of Delegates District 2 and District 90 seats became vacant upon the resignations of The Honorable Jennifer D. Carroll Foy and the Honorable Joseph C. Lindsey. Special Elections were called by the Governor of Virginia, The Honorable Ralph S. Northam, to fill the vacancies.
- There are two (2) localities in 2<sup>nd</sup> House of Delegates District; Prince William County and Stafford County.
- There are two (2) localities in the 90<sup>th</sup> House of Delegates District; Norfolk City and Virginia Beach City.
- Upon completion of the election, local general registrars entered all relevant election data into the Virginia Election and Registration System (VERIS).
- In accordance with Va. Code § 24.2-671, local electoral boards conducted provisional ballot meetings and canvasses to ascertain and certify election results for their localities.
- Upon completion of canvass, General Registrars forwarded their localities' certified Abstracts and, when applicable, Write-Ins Certifications, to the Department of Elections.
- Upon receipt of the localities Abstracts and Write-Ins Certifications, ELECT's Elections Administration staff checked them for errors and accepted the ascertained results as presented.


