COMMITTEE OF THE PROFESSIONAL BOXING, WRESTLING AND MARTIAL ARTS ADVISORY BOARD MEETING

MINUTES

A committee meeting was held on March 30, 2011, at the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation, 9960 Mayland Drive, Richmond, Virginia, with the following individuals present:

Mr. Dixon called the meeting to order at 5:08 p.m.

Call to Order

Public Comment Period – Matt Douglas, a promoter of amateur mixed martial arts (MMA) events, spoke to the committee. Mr. Douglas stated that without state regulation and recognition of amateur MMA events in Virginia, other jurisdictions, which require a certain number of amateur MMA bouts in order for someone to qualify for a license as a professional MMA fighter, sometimes do not recognize amateur MMA fights that occurred in Virginia. Mr. Douglas indicated he wants to be aware of, and comply with, any new requirements regarding the regulation of amateur MMA events and ensure that amateur MMA fighters are properly prepared for and given credit for amateur bouts in Virginia.

Arrival of Mr.

The committee members approved the agenda by consensus.

Approval of Agenda

Public Comment Period – Brian Crenshaw and Lindsey MacMhaolain, of the World Kickboxing Association USA, addressed the committee.

Public Comment Continued

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Mr. Crenshaw and Ms. MacMhaolain indicated they are supportive of state mandated safety standards for amateur MMA events. They suggested that the cost of regulating amateur MMA events could be minimized by approving sanctioning bodies. Once approved by the state, the sanctioning bodies would be responsible for the cost of the event including complying with any state mandated safety standards as well as required event officials (in lieu of the state providing the event officials). Mr. Crenshaw and Ms. MacMhaolain also discussed the regulatory schemes used in Delaware and Tennessee.

At the December 15, 2010, Advisory Board meeting, Mr. Dixon appointed a committee of Dr. Green, Mr. McCoy, Mr. Robinson, and Mr. Walters to look at the issue of oversight of amateur MMA events in Virginia. Mr. Dixon asked the committee to look at how other states deal with this issue, safety concerns, cost concerns, as well as the statutory provisions of §§ 54.1-829 A and 54.1-830 of the Code of Virginia.

Review Charge of Committee

The Director and the committee members reviewed the statutory provisions of §§ 54.1-829 A and 54.1-830 of the *Code of Virginia*.

Review §§ 54.1-829 A and 54.1-830 of the Code of Virginia

Mr. Dixon asked Mr. Holland to summarize and review the information obtained from the Association of Boxing Commissions (ABC) on this matter.

Review of Information from ABC

Mr. Holland suggested that by only regulating the promoters of amateur MMA events, the safety of the fighters could be achieved while minimizing the cost of regulation. Cost to the state and for the required license is an important factor and would be minimized as the state would not provide the officials for an event (the promoter would be required to do so).

Further discussion ensued as to whether amateur sanctioning bodies should be required to apply to the state for approval in order to conduct amateur MMA events.

After discussion, the committee agreed by consensus that some form of regulation of amateur MMA events is warranted.

Mr. Dixon requested the committee meet again in June to discuss potential regulation changes which would be required in order to effectively and efficiently regulate amateur MMA events in anticipation

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of the existing law being amended to provide the state with the authority to regulate amateur MMA events. Prior to the June meeting, Mr. Dixon also requested staff to obtain and review the regulations of other states which regulate amateur MMA along with their associated budget and revenue information.

There was no other business to discuss.
