This regulatory reduction action will allow a contractor to have more than one individual complete the business examination required of Designated Employees, allowing the firm to have an alternate readily available to be named the Designated Employee in the event the current Designated Employee leaves. By having this individual already complete the examination requirements, the burden of having to identify a new Designated Employee and have them successfully complete the examination within the required time frame set forth in the regulations, is reduced.

Additionally, the amendment extends the time frame for reporting and registering a new Designated Employee or member of Responsible Management from 90 days to 120 days, further reducing the compliance burden on licensees.

#### **Mandate and Impetus**

Chapter 503 of the 2019 Acts of the Assembly directed the Board for Contractors to revise its regulations to allow multiple individuals from a single firm to sit for the Designated Employee business examination and to review current regulations and procedures pertaining to the time allowed for changes of the Designated Employee. Because the majority of Designated Employees are also members of Responsible Management, the Board determined it appropriate to extend the time allowed for those changes as well.
