The proposed amendments will focus solely a review of the current classes of license and changes in the industry, brought to the attention of the Board by licensees and waste management facilities, as a result in advances in composting, waste-to-energy, recycling and other technologies. The review will amend the definitions of the scope of practice allowed the current classes of license and, if necessary, add an additional class of license that will ensure that operators of those types of facilities are adequately trained and meet the minimum competency requirements, ultimately producing updated regulations that will effectively protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public.
