House Bill 1842 from the 2017 General Assembly Session changed Section 4.1-119(E) of the Code of Virginia to increase the proof limit for grain alcohol sold in government stores from 101 to 151. Pursuant to Enactment clause 2 of that bill, that provision had a sunset date of July 1, 2022. Senate Bill 527 of the 2022 General Assembly Session repealed the sunset clause. The regulation needs to be revised so that it removes the sunset provision and replaces the 101 proof limit with the 151 proof limit.
