Code § 2.2-2100, and (ii) authorized the Commissioner of Agriculture and Consumer Services to promulgate regulations to carry out the provisions of the Charitable Gaming Law (Article 1.1:1 of Chapter 8 of Title 18.2 of the Code). Chapters 554 and 609 of the 2022 Acts of Assembly provide that the regulations of the Charitable Gaming Board shall be administered by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and shall remain in full force and effect until the Commissioner of Agriculture and Consumer Services promulgates regulations. The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services is currently conducting a separate regulatory action to promulgate, Charitable Gaming Regulations, 11 VAC 20-20, which will consist of the regulatory provisions established in 11 VAC 15-40 and new provisions regarding electronic gaming.
