This regulatory change requires that recreational boaters remove aquatic vegetation from their boats, trailers, and equipment upon removing the boat from the water. Boaters are also required to open drain plugs, and are to take reasonable measures to dry bilges, livewells, baitwells, and ballast tanks before their boats are used on other bodies of water.

## **Mandate and Impetus**

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The impetus for these regulatory changes is the Board's biennial periodic review of its Boating regulations. Internal staff review and consideration of subsequent public comment through the Board's regulatory development process found this change advisable based on goals to prevent the spread of invasive species, many of which can be transported from one waterbody to another by traveling on boats used in various waterbodies. Other states/regions of states have either proposed or enacted very stringent requirements on boaters to prevent invasive species spread. In Virginia, the Department hopes that employment of some commonsense measures by the boating community can avoid the need for more aggressive actions and still allow the Commonwealth to prevent the spread of invasive species.
