This regulatory change adds the North Fork of Moormans River and its tributaries from the head of Sugar Hollow Reservoir upstream 0.3 miles to the Shenandoah National Park boundary to the list of trout waters found in 4VAC15-330-150 in which all trout fishing must be done using artificial lures with single hooks, and all trout caught must be released.

The impetus for these regulatory changes is the Board’s biennial periodic review of its Aquatics/freshwater fishing regulations. Internal staff review and consideration of subsequent public comment through the Board’s regulatory development process found this change advisable based on fisheries management goals for the affected waterbody.

The Board of Wildlife Resources adopted these final amendments to regulations found in 4VAC15-330 (Fish: Trout Fishing) at its meeting held on August 18, 2022.
