To fulfill the statutory mandate to review regulations and to protect the citizens of the Commonwealth, the Virginia Department of Health conducted a periodic review of 12 VAC 5-550 *et seq.* "Regulations Governing Vital Records" pursuant to Executive Order (EO) 14 (2010). As a result of this review, the Virginia Department of Health plans to begin the regulatory process to amend these regulations. The purpose of the intended amendments is to identify correct statutory authority, improve clarity of language and to add necessary sections, such as regulations governing birth certificates created under the authority established in § 63.2-1200.1(B) of the Code of Virginia for foreign born children, and adding the requirements for amending or correcting birth and death certificates.

The regulation is promulgated under the authority of §32.1-12 and §32.17-250 of Chapter 7 of Title 32.1 of the Code of Virginia. Section 32.1-12 grants the Board of Health the legal authority to make, adopt, promulgate, and enforce such regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of Title 32.1 of the Code and other laws of the Commonwealth administered by it. Section 32.1-250 of the Code of Virginia requires the Board of Health to install, maintain and operate the only system of vital records throughout this Commonwealth.

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Need

The Virginia Department of Health conducted a periodic review of the Regulations Governing Vital Records. Although there were no public comments received during the periodic review, it was determined that some regulations needed clarification, others that did not conform to Code needed correction and specific regulations needed to be added. These proposed amendments will make the regulations more comprehensible to affected entities and the public while at the same time protecting the integrity of the vital record system.

The proposed amendments are necessary for the clarification, addition or enhancements to the regulations that include:

- 1. The correct statutory authority;
- 2. Adding the definition of a certified nurse midwife and a certified professional midwife;
- 3. The correct fee for a certified vital record (births, deaths, marriages and divorces);
- 4. Adding a regulatory section for creating a birth certificate for a foreign born child adopted in a foreign country to citizens of the Commonwealth based on §63.2-1200.1 of the Code of Virginia;
- 5. Correcting the regulation in regards to requirements needed to amend the birth certificate of a person who has had a medical procedure to change their gender;
- 6. Clarification regarding the requirements for amending or correcting a birth or death certificate;
- Clarifications regarding the issuance of certified vital records (births, deaths, marriages and divorces);
- 8. Adding the Surrogate Consent and Report Form to the list of forms issued by the State Registrar and;
- 9. Clarification on matters such as physicians signing death certificates with dark blue ink and the data to appear on a vital record.
