This action changes the daily administrative responsibilities for the Individuals and Families with Developmental Disabilities Support (DD Waiver) from the Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS) to the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services (DBHDS). This action also: (i) updates references to mental retardation to more acceptable intellectual disability, (such as changing Intermediate Care Facility for the Mentally Retarded to Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disability); (ii) updates existing form names and numbers; (iii) changes old references to prior authorization to the new terminology of service authorization, moves existing requirements to more logical places in the text, (iv) updates state agency names, as appropriate, and; (v) removes references to the Medicaid AIDS waiver.

The *Code of Virginia* (1950) as amended, § 32.1-325, grants to the Board of Medical Assistance Services the authority to administer and amend the Plan for Medical Assistance. The *Code of Virginia* (1950) as amended, § 32.1-324, authorizes the Director of DMAS to administer and amend the Plan for Medical Assistance according to the Board's requirements. The Medicaid authority as established by § 1902 (a) of the *Social Security Act* [42 U.S.C. 1396a] provides governing authority for payments for services.

DMAS retains unto itself, pursuant to 42 CFR § 431.10, its final authority for this waiver and the claiming of the federal financial participation (federal funding).

The *Code of Virginia* § 2.2-4006(A)(2) and (3) permits certain agency actions to be exempt from the public notice and comment requirements set out in the *Code*:

"2. Regulations that establish or prescribe agency organization, internal practice or procedures, including delegations of authority." The change contained herein concerning DBHDS administering the DD waiver, in lieu of DMAS, is a delegation of authority.

"3. Regulations that consist only of changes in style or form or corrections of technical errors." The other changes in this action (changing references to the DMAS-122 form to the DMAS-225 form, changing references to ICF/MR to ICF/IID, changing references of prior authorization to service authorization, changing 30-day extension periods to 30 calendar days, moving existing text to better locations, and updating state agency names) are changes in style or form and effect no policy changes in the DD waiver.

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The removal of references to the Medicaid HIV/AIDS waiver is based on the 2013 Acts of the Assembly, Chapter 806, Item 307 JJJ which provided for the amendment of the Elderly or Disabled with Consumer Direction waiver to incorporate HIV/AIDS waiver. This change was approved by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services on XXXXXX.

Substance

CURRENT POLICY

The regulations that are affected by this action are 12 VAC 30-120-700 et. seq., the Individual and Family Developmental Disabilities Support Waiver.

Currently, this waiver is administered by the Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS) and DMAS claims the federal financial participation provided by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. These regulations contain references to Intermediate Care Facilities for the Mentally Retarded (ICF/MR), form names/numbers which have been modified, outdated state agency names, and outdated terminology (such as the term 'prior authorization').

RECOMMENDATIONS

By mutual agreement, DMAS is delegating to the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services (DBHDS) the administration of this waiver. By federal action, use of the term ICF/MR was changed to Intermediate Care Facilities for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IID). The terms 'mental retardation' and 'mentally retarded' have been removed from the lexicon due to their pejorative nature.

DMAS has replaced its Patient Pay Information form (DMAS-122) with the Long Term Care Communication form (DMAS-225). DMAS has changed its terminology about the 'prior authorization' of certain services to 'service authorization' of those same services. DMAS is also updating these regulations to reflect the updated names of sister state agencies (such as the Department of Rehabilitative Services has changed to the Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Services).

HIV/AIDS Waiver

The 2013 Acts of the Assembly provided for this waiver to be incorporated into the Elderly or Disabled with Consumer Direction (EDCD) waiver, with the approval of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). CMS approved this change on XXXXX and the remaining few AIDS waiver individuals were shifted into the EDCD waiver for their ongoing care. These individuals (fewer than 50) experienced no disruption in care or services.

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Family impact
