Subject Sawmills, §1910.265; Amendments

<u>Purpose</u> This directive transmits to field personnel amendments to the Sawmills standard, which

resulted from the adoption of the Final Rule on Walking-Working Surfaces (81 FR 82494, 18

November 2016).

This Program Directive is an internal guideline, not a statutory or regulatory rule, and is intended to provide instructions to VOSH personnel regarding internal operation of the Virginia Occupational Safety and Health Program and is solely for the benefit of the program. This document is not subject to the Virginia Register Act or the Administrative Process Act; it does not have general application and is not being enforced as having the

force of law.

Scope This Directive applies VOSH-wide.

I. Background

On November 18, 2016, federal OSHA published its new Final Rule on Walking-Working Surfaces (81 FR 82494), which also impacted §1910.265, Sawmills, in Subpart R – Special Industries.

On February 16, 2017, the Safety and Health Codes Board adopted the new Final Rule on Walking-Working Surfaces and its resulting amendment to §1910.265, Sawmills, with an effective date of May 15, 2017.

II. Summary

In addition to promulgating the new standard on Walking-Working Surfaces, federal OSHA amended §1910.265, Sawmills, by revising paragraphs (c)(4)(v), (c)(5)(i), and (f)(6) to reference Subpart D, Walking-Working Surfaces, §§1910.21 through 1910.30, to ensure that employers comply with all of the applicable general industry ladder requirements.

■ 19. In § 1910.265, revise paragraphs (c)(4)(v), (c)(5)(i), and (f)(6) to read asfollows:

§ 1910.265 Sawmills.

(c) * * * (d) * * * (v) Elevated platforms. Where elevated platforms are used routinely on a daily basis, they shall be equipped with stairways or fixed ladders that comply with subpart D of this part.

(5) * * *

(i) Construction. Stairways shall be constructed in accordance with subpart D of this part.

(f) * * * (6) Ladders. A fixed ladder complying with the requirements of subpart D of this part, or other adequate means, shall be provided to permit access to the roof. Where controls and machinery are mounted on the roof, a permanent stairway with standard handrail shall be installed in accordance with the requirements in subpart D.
