The meeting was called to order and Chairman Trent welcomed all attendees.

I. <u>Committee Chairman</u>

Chairman Trent called for a motion to approve the July 17, 2019 minutes. Ms. deSocio requested some changes by email.

By *Motion* by Chairman Trent, the September 18, 2019 minutes were *Approved* as amended.

II. Funding and Budget Issues (Ms. Robyn deSocio, State Compensation Board)

Ms. deSocio did not attend the November meeting, but sent an email to recommend changes to the September minutes.

III. <u>Prison/Local Jail Population Report and Jail Construction Update – Mr. Bob Casey</u>

Mr. Casey reported that Prince William/Manassas Regional Jail (204 bed expansion) is on schedule for completion by the anticipated date of July 2020. Henry County has signed a contract with English Construction of Lynchburg and the project is expected to begin shortly with an anticipated completion date of January 2022.

Offender Management Service Update - Mr. Jim Parks

Jim Parks reported the total for out-of-compliance inmates is 3,101 of which 2,731 are males and 370 are females. Female offenders are being processed at State Farm in Powhatan. The female out-of-compliance population ticked up slightly while the facility was being prepared for female classification as the Virginia Department of Corrections is trying to accommodate increased female populations.

IV. Other Business

Chairman Trent noted that there is a bill from the state senate (SB1772) directing the Board of Corrections to review the pregnant prisoners use of restraint standard. The current language suggests minimal restraint as the default but it was the intent of the patron of the bill that the intent was for no restraint to be the default. The wording will be reviewed for clarification.
