Virginia Sexual and Domestic Violence Program Professional Standards Committee

Code of Virginia: 9.1-116.3

The Virginia Sexual and Domestic Violence Program Professional Standards Committee (the Committee):

- Shall establish <u>voluntary accreditation standards and procedures</u> by which local sexual and domestic violence programs can be systematically measured and evaluated with a <u>peer-reviewed process</u>.
- May adopt bylaws for its operation, membership terms, fees, and other items as necessary.
- <u>Fees for accreditation</u> shall be used to support any administrative costs of the Department.
- Upon request of the Committee, the Department and the Virginia sexual and domestic violence coalition may
 provide <u>accreditation assistance</u> and <u>training</u> and <u>resource material</u> that will assist the local programs in
 obtaining or retaining accreditation.

Vision/Purpose/Value Statement

Vision

Throughout Virginia, all those impacted by Sexual and Domestic Violence have accessible, community-driven quality services and resources.

Purpose

To create standards that:

- 1. Credential Sexual and Domestic Violence agencies.
- Ensure research-based best practices and inspire Sexual and Domestic Violence organizations to learn and evolve in order to best meet the needs of all those impacted by Sexual and Domestic Violence.
- 3. Ensure an informed core level of services is available to all those impacted by Sexual and Domestic Violence throughout Virginia.
