Mr. Quesenberry asked if there was any public comment.

Public Comment Period

Ms. Gail Novak, Cosmetology Instructor at Fluvanna Correctional Center for Women, addressed the Board regarding inmates seeking licensure. Ms. Novak stated that the \$15.00 cost to obtain a criminal history report may not seem like a lot of money, but to an inmate that averages .20¢ an hour it is a large sum of money including the cost of postage as well as the licensure application which is currently \$55.00.

Ms. Novak asked the Board to consider a policy that would give guidance to applicants with a criminal history. The policy would give direction on which criminal convictions would be applicable to the application.

There being no further comment before the Board, the public comment period ended.

File Number 2005-Swanner, the Board reviewed the records, which consisted of the 05052 Sandra K. application file, transcript, exhibits, and Summary of the Informal Swanner Fact-Finding Conference. Ms. Swanner did not appear at the meeting in person, by counsel, or by any other qualified representative.

Upon a motion by Mr. Howard-Seldon and seconded by Mr. Howell-Seldon the Board voted to approved Ms. Swanner's cosmetology license application.

The members voting 'yes' were Mr. Anders, Ms. Girardi, Ms. Howard-Seldon, Mr. Howell, and Mr. Quesenberry. There was one abstention, Mr. Do. There were no negative votes. The motion passed by majority.

Mr. Schroder summarized House Bill 1932 that was passed by the Citation 2005 Virginia General assembly and became effect July 1, 2005. This Recommendations bill increased the Board's authority concerning disciplinary actions it may impose on its licensees. Mr. Schroder explained the difference between consent agreements and consent orders.

Mr. Schroder reviewed the DRAFT Citation Recommendations that if applicable would be used for violations. Mr. Schroder concluded his presentation by fielding questions from board members.

Upon a motion by Mr. Howard-Seldon and seconded by Mr. Howell the Board voted to approve the Citation Recommendations.

The members voting 'yes' were Mr. Anders, Mr. Do, Ms. Girardi, Ms. Howard-Seldon, Mr. Howell, and Mr. Quesenberry. There were no negative votes. The motion passed unanimously.

The Board recessed at 9:54 am and reconvened at 10:07am.

Ms. O'Neal provided training on regulatory review process including the standard regulatory process, emergency regulations, fast-track regulations, the APA, petition for rule making, and pending regulatory actions. Ms. O'Neal concluded this portion of the training by fielding questions from the board members.

The Board took under consideration the public comment received Hair Braiding Public pertaining to the Proposed Hair Braiding Regulations. The Board reviewed the hair braiding public comments and responses to the comments received.

The Board was informed that the NOIRA for the Esthetics Esthetics Regulations Regulations has been published in the Virginia Registrar and on the Town Hall and the 30 day public comment period ended November 30, 2005.

The Board was informed that the Proposed Body-Piercing Regulations were approved by the Governor

Mr. Anders reported to the Board on his attendance at the National Conference Reports Association of Barbers Boards of America 79th conference, and Mr. Ouesenberry reported to the Board on the National Interstate Council of State Board of Cosmetology (NIC) 50th annual conference.

Mr. Anders reported on his attendance at the National Association of Barbers Boards of America 79th conference held in Myrtle Beach, of Barber Boards of South Carolina on September 18-23, 2005. Mr. Anders stated that 27 states were represented at the conference. Mr. Anders stated there were several topics of discussion at the conference, national testing of which 37 states administered the same exam, falsified license, hair braiding, chair rental, and the barber pole. Mr. Anders reported only one state does not regulate the barber profession, Alabama.

America

Mr. Anders concluded his reported by thanking the Board for allowing him to represent Virginia at the conference.

Mr. Quesenberry reported on the National Interstate Council of State Board of Cosmetology (NIC) 50th annual conference held in Council of State Washington, DC on August 27-29, 2005. Mr. Quesenberry stated that **Board of**

Mr. Quesenberry stated that the conference began its focus on education and sanitation and then moved to talk about licensure endorsement as well as body piercing and tattooing and advanced esthetics licensure.

Mr. Quesenberry concluded the reported by advising the Board that the next conference is scheduled for Portland, Maine August 26-28, 2006.

The proposed 2006 board meeting dates are Monday, February 6, Meeting Dates 2006 and Monday, April 10, 2006. The remaining dates will be determined following regulatory action deadlines.
