#### MINUTES OF MEETING

The Common Interest Community Board met on June 4, 2015, at the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (DPOR), 9960 Mayland Drive, 2nd Floor, Board Room 4, Richmond, Virginia 23233.

Elizabeth Peay from the Office of the Attorney General was present.

Finding a quorum of the Board present, Ms. Trigiani, Chair, called the Call to Order meeting to order at 9:52 a.m.

Ms. Trigiani advised the Board of the emergency evacuation **Emergency** Evacuation procedures. **Procedures** 

Mr. Orlando moved to approve the agenda as amended. Mr. Melson Approval of Agenda seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Johnson, Kacani, Melson, Orlando, Trigiani and Watts.

Mr. Melson moved that the Board approve the minutes of the March 26, 2015, Board meeting. Mr. Orlando seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Johnson, Kacani, Melson, Orlando, Trigiani

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and Watts.

Ms. Henshaw welcomed and introduced Emily Trent, Administrative Welcome & Assistant; Elizabeth Peay, Assistant Attorney General; and Sean Introduction of Staff Mullican, Intern for the Common Interest Community Board.

Ms. Trigiani opened the floor for public comment.

Public Comment Period

John Niland, resident of Kingsmill in Williamsburg, Virginia, addressed the Board with concerns regarding his developer-controlled homeowner's association.

Lenny Byrl, resident of Kingsmill in Williamsburg, Virginia, addressed the Board with concerns of conflict of interests of the Association that are not disclosed to residents. Mr. Byrl also voiced his concerns about common areas that are seized and repurposed by association boards.

Mr. Niland and Mr. Byrl were provided with information regarding the complaint process.

The Board reviewed a memorandum from staff dated May 27, 2015, Revised June 2, 2015, to consider issuance of temporary cease and desist orders against the following condominium project registrations where the declarants failed to submit annual reports and bond/letters of credit verification forms:

After reviewing the facts and information presented in the memorandum at the Board meeting, the Board determined that the declarants failed to file an annual report within thirty (30) days of the anniversary date of the condominium project registrations as required by § 55-79.93 of the Code of Virginia.

After discussion, Ms. Kacani made a motion to issue Temporary Cease and Desist Orders in accordance with § 55-79.100(b) of the Code of Virginia which states:

> "If the agency makes a finding of fact in writing that the public interest will be irreparably harmed by delay in issuing an order, it may issue a temporary cease and

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> desist order. Prior to issuing the temporary cease and desist order, the agency shall give notice of the proposal to issue a temporary cease and desist order to the person. Every temporary cease and desist order shall include in its terms a provision that upon request a hearing will be held promptly to determine whether or not it becomes permanent."

The declarants of the registrants must cease and desist from the sale of units in the condominium project until annual reports and assessment bond or letter of credit verification forms, as applicable, are submitted and determined to be acceptable by the Board. If the declarants fail to cease and desist the unlawful practice after entry of the Order, the Board may refer the matters for enforcement pursuant to § 54.1-306 of the Code of Virginia, and/or impose sanctions and take other actions permitted by Chapter 4.2 of Title 55 (§§ 55-79.39 et seq.) of the Code of Virginia. The orders remain in effect until the declarants submit acceptable documentation to the Board that the necessary affirmative actions have been taken to correct the deficiencies or the matters are adjudicated, whichever is later. Mr. Orlando seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Johnson, Kacani, Melson, Orlando, Trigiani and Watts.

Ms. Trigiani transferred the Chair to Mr. Melson and recused herself Transfer of Chair from the meeting.

Ms. Kacani advised the Board that the Committee reviewed for approval the training program application from MercerTrigiani. The training program titled 2015 Legal and Legislative Update for Virginia Common Review Committee Interest Community Association (Law and Regulation) is a Virginia common interest community law and regulation training program. MercerTrigiani requested retroactive approval to May 14, 2015.

Report from **Training Program** 

Upon thorough review of the application, Ms. Kacani moved that the Committee recommend Board approval of the law and regulation training program application, retroactive to May 14, 2015, contingent on MercerTrigiani amending the syllabus to reflect the regulatory content requirements found at 18 VAC 48-50-253.

Mr. Orlando seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by: Johnson, Kacani, Melson, Orlando and Watts.

Ms. Trigiana returned to the meeting and resumed the position of Chair.

The Common Interest Community Board Time-Share Regulations action to incorporate an amendment resulting from Senate Bill 348 to incorporate alternative purchase registration provisions are in the fasttrack stage and are currently undergoing review by the Governor's office.

Ms. Henshaw discussed the potential legislative ideas for the 2016 General Assembly Session. The Board reviewed the memorandum with a list of ten legislative recommendations. Mr. Melson moved to approve the proposed legislative items and authorize the Executive Director to forward the items to the next step of the 2016 legislative process. Ms. Johnson seconded the motion. The motion was withdrawn.

Preparing for 2016 **General Assembly** Session

Ms. Kacani moved to approve the proposed legislative items and authorize the Executive Director to forward the items to the next step of the 2016 legislative process with the exception of list item number 3. Ms. Johnson seconded the motion which was approved by: Johnson, Kacani, Melson and Trigiani. Member abstaining was: Orlando. Member voting "No" was: Watts. The motion passed with a majority vote.
